Gordon was always grateful for anything that was done for him and he displayed that gratitude easily and often. Always at the centre of family gatherings, he was the hub that strengthened our family circle. He taught us acceptance, tolerance and patience. His ability to put situations into perspective with a few concise phrases is his legacy to the entire family.
